Mr. Geller gave updates on the following initiatives/events:

c) School Success Planning

i. Student Anxiety Workshop

- teachers & staff received a 1/2 day workshop with 2 psychologists (E.
 Bloom and J. Weintraub) who sit in on mental health excellence committee at school board
- how to identify and address student anxiety and at what point to refer
- · possibility for future consults
- · arose from Smart Goals meetings at the end of last year

ii. W.I.T.S. Program

- pro-social behaviour program that will be integrated in school curriculum addressing conflict, potential violence and potential bullying
- · co-coordinated by Mr. Geller and Anne Vrana
- W.I.T.S.= Walk away, Ignore, Talk it out, Seek help
- program written by teachers, bilingual, low-cost, grass roots and literacy based
- successfully implemented at Greendale
- October 15 = launch assembly with police officers, fire fighters, public security; with grades K-2 and 3-6
- posters, magnets, badges, banners, stuffed animals and brochures for students/parents
- · Peace Pals will also be involved

Questions/Suggestions raised by parent committee members

- one concern was whether program will reach out to those individuals not using their "WITS" and how we intended to address these particular individuals
- suggestion was made to bring in guest speakers to compliment program and further connect with children like they did last year with Josh Bourque from the Allouettes (ex. Chris Nilan Montreal Canadians etc...)
 - will be evaluated perhaps later in the year once WITS program has been implemented; additional guest speakers/performers were welcomed as suggestions and would also be considered
- another question arose whether there was a program specifically targeted for parents (ex. last year's Dare to Care program at St. Edmonds)
 - brochure will be distributed to parents introducing them to WITS program and providing them general information along with additional references to online resources, videos and books

d) EpiPen Training

- staff underwent intensive review of EpiPen protocol
- nurse has updated all notes, pictures and files of students
- 2 staff (J. Bouchard & A. Couto) received 2 day emergency responder training plus other staff certified with CPR and first aid
