#### **5.5. REGIONAL PARENT'S REPORT (Adolfo)**

- meeting attended was information seminar on MSC; information can be accessed on website
- also discussed how to present Briefs

#### **5.6. COMMISSIONER'S REPORT - (Domenic)**

Minutes from the March 30th and April 27th Council meeting were communicated in advance to GB. Key components from these two meetings are briefly summarized below.

##### **March 30th meeting**

- MSC consultation passed
- Resolution: By-law 11 (2015) – Delegation of Functions (“a public body may not enter into a service contract if the contract eludes the workforce-related control measures taken under this Act”) Bill 15 is the main issue here as government wants to know and follow the number of employees of government agencies.

##### **April 27th meeting**

- number of administrative position changes (shifting, retirements etc); cascading effect being felt
- Mr. Robert T Mills, Director General of the LBPSB, has decided to retire. A career spanning 42 years, from teacher to department head to DG of LBPSB for the last 9 years.
- Home Schooling Policy has passed
- Resolution for an update to the Transportation User Fees (2015-2016); Courtesy and accommodation services at \$160 for elementary school students and at \$290 for accommodation services for secondary school students, with a maximum of \$320 per family and \$580 per school year
- Food Services Contract signed (HS Cafeteria Services and Caf Mobile); only 3 interested and only 1 bid; many companies unable to manage Caf Mobile service
- Recommendation to MELS regarding the Budgetary Cuts - asking MELS to make the necessary budgetary cuts based on the past three years history of their own management indicators
- Other - Mr. Blais (minister of MELS) wants to abolish school boards and substitute with something else; timeframe - to begin Sept 2016

### **7.1. MSC DISCUSSION & PLAN OF ACTION**

Renee gave a brief overview of the Major School Change (MSC) Consultation Process, timeline of events, resources, and the next steps involved.

#### **Who is being consulted?**

- The Board is soliciting input from a wide range of stakeholders including GB, parents, teachers, students and community leaders

#### **Timeline**

1. **MSC Launch** - March 30, 2015
2. **MSC Consultation Meetings** - April – November 2015
3. **Written Briefs** - submitted by October 31, 2015
4. **Public Hearings** - November 17-19, 2015
5. **Final Decisions** - will be taken at a meeting of the Council of Commissioners by December 14th, 2015 (if possible) but no later than January 15th, 2016
6. Changes, if any, take effect July 1, 2016 for the 2016-2017 school year

**LBP numbers - adendum 5** (A. Geller)

- destination of english eligible students living on LBP territories (from Ontario border to Verdun) shows 78-79% (0.2% variance) from 2010 to 2013/14; shows system is shrinking (enrollment is not dwindling down)
- mentioned that LBP was down 11% but french public schools down 14%
- we've done very well at retaining % kids; just absolute numbers are declining
