5.3. DAYCARE REPORT (Jutta)

The following is a brief summary of the Daycare Report that was communicated in advance to the GB committee. Any additional questions/comments arising from the meeting are also noted below.

a) Ped Day (June 8th)

- indoors due to rain; played carnival games in every corner of the school
- hot dogs, veggies with dip, chips, juice and freezies served for lunch

b) The Family Tree Mural

- students finished painting and decorating flowers, snowflakes and blossoms for tree mural during lunch hours
- Daycare, along with Miss Karen, Miss Ann and Mrs. Bouchard have added a sun, roads, hills, buildings, birds...even added new K students!

c) Updates In Daycare Procedures

- New Updates will be noted in next year's Parent Info Pkg.
 - Daycare students that are picked up early on any day must only be pickup up after 2:45. This will help alleviate congestions at the front door, and speed up the clearing of the buses.
 - Daycare students who, on occasion are to take the bus home, must come
 to school knowing that they are to take the bus home and an email must be
 sent to secretary, the teacher and the Daycare. A phone call or message
 left to the secretary is not acceptable.

d) Daycare Fees

The following note about Daycare Fees was communicated in meeting:

Currently have 185 children attending MMES Daycare. Aside from the recent increase to \$7.30/day, Daycare Fees have not increased for over 6 yrs. The Government Subsidized Daycare Fee rate is going up to \$8.00 per day starting Sept. 1, 2015. At the same time, the MELS grant has decreased by \$150/student. Due to this as well as salary increases, the cost of supplies and equipment, Daycare is asking that other Fees be raised as follows:

1) Lunch Fees

- Lunch Fees for 5 days per week to increase to \$35.00/month (currently at \$33/month)
- Lunch Fees for 4 days per week to increase to \$26.50/month (currently at \$25/month)
- Lunch Fees for 3 days per week to increase to \$18.00/month (currently at \$17/month)

2) Daycare Fees - Sporadic Users

• Daycare Fees for Sporadic Users and 2 day per week Daycare users to be increased to \$13.00 per day (currently at \$12.00 per day).

3) Daycare Fees For 3/4 Days/Week on Non-Daycare Lunch Days

- Daycare Fees for 3/4 days per week Daycare users on Non-Daycare Lunch Days to increase to \$2.50 per day (currently at \$2.00 per day).
- Some other LBP schools have already implemented these rates and higher.

Question 1 - Does daycare fall under MSC?

- suggested that this question be posted on MSC website
- Discussion: offer children extra curricular programs after school during daycare hours in partnership with high schools (example: basketball 1-2x per week with John Rennie)
 - · high school gets exposure
 - parents wouldn't have to sign up on evenings and weekends
 - · reduces number of students physically in Daycare and staff needed
 - example: Sherwood Forrest offers after school hockey program
 - ultimate goal: keep kids within LBP schools
- Jutta mentioned that Daycare staff would still be needed to attend extra curricular activities as Daycare is ultimately responsible for children
- idea was well received; suggested that we try this as a pilot program in 2015-2016

Question 2 - Are proposed increase in Daycare Fees enough considering proposed cuts in MELS Grants (-\$150/student).

Yes; increases will also help fund eventual cuts in MELS Grants.

7. BUSINESS ARISING FROM MINUTES

7.1. JUNE PROPOSED BUDGET

Mr. Geller gave a detailed update on the March 31st Actual Budget for 2014-2015 for both school and daycare in addition to May-June Proposed Budget for 2015-2016. Both school and daycare budget reports are filed with the school.

Some key points noted:

- student enrolment (school) for 2015-2016 is slightly down 5% at 300 students
- attestation date is September 30th, 2015
- Anticipated Total Revenue for School in 2015-16 is \$74,700 and for Daycare is \$443,146

Daycare

Particular cuts in revenue noted for upcoming 2015-2016 year (vs 2013-2014):

School

- Operating Fund per capita (-12%) - Salaries/Materials (-30%) - Library Grant Fund (-50%) - Handicapped (-50%)

- School Fees (-19%) - Pedagogical Days (-50%* final numbers still under discussion)

Comments:

 Proposed that School/Daycare present a "Wish List" at beginning of year similar to Teacher's Wish List.

- Jackie was forthcoming about parents needs and wants, what they were hoping for
- Mr. Geller and Mr. Rhymes shared their initial perspective on what we could/couldn't do
- Some take home points:
 - School administration understands that timely and transparent communication is very important to parents. However, due to legal restrictions, privacy of the students of those impacted and at the request of the local police department, we are prohibited from sending school-wide communications summarizing incidents. Any public communication on such issues must come through more formal channels (i.e. police)
 - Questions and concerns related to events occurring in the neighbouring community should be addressed to the local police for an update, as the school is not positioned to obtain facts and disseminate information
 - Given the restrictions mentioned, parents are encouraged to address concerns and questions specific to our students to Mr. Geller. Mr. Geller can be reached in person or by telephone or email all contact information is available on the school website
 - clarified to parents that school is in constant and direct contact with police; have a dedicated socio-community officers that liaises with schools and community groups
 - Mr. Geller has requested for an open community town hall meeting with the police and strongly urged parents do the same. Unfortunately, at the present time, law enforcement are dedicating their resources toward educating children on how to be safe in schools (Cycle 3).
