6. BUSINESS ARISING FROM MINUTES

6.1. MSC RECAP

- MMES status quo
- we were not granted our request for zones 15 & 16 given to St Charles instead as it has less students
- Other: St. Pauls and Sherwood will merge, St. Paul's will become an FP school (junior campus) and Sherwood Forest will also become an FP school (senior campus); potential for EI or B students to be attracted to MMES due to its EI program.
- other potential for MMES proposal for 5000 homes in L'Anse-à-L'Orme area in immediate future

6.2. TEACHERS STRIKE UPDATE

- union rep accepted gov't offer and teachers will vote to see if they ratify decision on Thursday
- support staff is also voting but next Monday Night (including custodians)
- it was noted that french board teacher's union have not accepted agreement
- The Agreement accepted was: class sizes remain same except K where max decreases by one; special needs status quo (no coding); salaries = 7.75% over 5 years
- What about activities? Prepared to launch ECAs pending vote teachers had a meeting and a wish list of ECAs was generated, ready to be implemented

7.5.CAPITAL BUDGETS

Capital expenditures under \$50,000

- 1. upgrading domestic water entry
 - not at code; cost \$15,000
- 2. moving basket ball hoop in gym
 - not aligned; hoop near door way therefore a safety hazard; cost = \$5000

Capital expenditures over \$50,000

- 1. doubling kindergarten exit doors
 - cost = \$175,000
 - to take place during summer months
 - · concerns were raised about the cost associated with this expenditure
 - question was also raised why doors have yet to be fixed given this was approved 3
 yrs ago it was speculated that our fire drill times were considered highly efficient and
 could be reason why this is not a high priority item
- 2. replacement of K windows
 - currently windows open bottom out at height of child's head (safety hazard)
 - want to install sliding windows
 - rubberized material has been temporarily installed on edges to reduce chance of injury
 - cost = \$150,000

Other requests brought forward by GB

- air conditioning for gymnasium
 - gym is too hot during warmer months; external door are often opened for circulation
 - Julie-Ann raised concern of potential strangers wandering into building if Phys Ed doors need to be opened due to lack of air circulation
 - Mr. Geller mentioned air circulation need to be tested
