#### 8. REPORTS

8.1 Principal's Report

- Recently received a sizable grant for something called Initiatives, or Innovation Grant;
- The grant consists of \$9000 and can be spent on technology, intercultural studies, health and well-being.
- Plan is to visit a fellow elementary school to see their innovations.
- First grant may be only a trial to see how the projects work out.
- English school boards are expected to come up with some amazing projects.
- Mr. Geller thanked the support for the Families helping families.
- Universal design for learning \$3000 used for adaptable and flexible classroom structures; reading corners; curtains, high and low desks.
- Students have been enjoying guest speakers and trips, such as the Ecomuseum for Kindergarten, Native Dance expert in Grade 3, Quebec Cinema for Grade 5, BHS Improv and Band for all Grades, and Cycle 2 trip to the Science Center.
- Student Safety Campaign kicking off with a renewal with our partnership with The Missing Children's Foundation to promote street safety, personal safety, online safety, etc.
- Open House will take place in January 2017 and team is working hard to prepare.
- Tell them from Me (TTFM) annual survey, due to contractual problems, we were unable to do a Fall survey; anticipate those are resolved and will do April survey.
- Success Plan province wide have been halted and put on the back burner; will give direct bearing on how the Bill 105 passed last week Nov 23<sup>rd</sup>; will be part of the law; changed school success plan method; workshops are being held and administrators learning; law is not a huge change; the names are the major change.
- Biggest change is giving parent commissioners the vote and parent representatives will take part (4 in total).
- Resource Allocation Meeting (15 principals) main purpose is to make recommendations to the budget; not a huge change in our board as principals here are already part of the budgeting process.

- We are starting the holiday festivities for Holiday week.
- Holiday week will take place December 19-23, 2016 and will include holiday bingo, theatre, holiday breakfast, pajama day, etc.
- Grade 5/6 is starting a band.

## 8.3 Daycare Report

- Chartwells Student Dining is doing well; introducing new meals and desserts which the kids seem to like.
- Educaction there will be new lunch-time activities added in January schedule, such as NASA Academy by Mad Science, Dance Mania, Chess, Ceramics.

- Corp business long term planning committee; enrollment in school board is declining -; in 3-5 years, 21,000 children down to 18,000 children; what can we do differently to increase our enrollment? Part of the reason is due to people moving out of province; new immigrants who are not allowed to come.
- School board has done a lot and hired teachers that are Francophone.
- School Board has given up some properties; government has given additional funding (2.7million) to give up these properties to Marguerite Bourgeois; MB pushed them to do it because they needed the school; agreement is on the capital only, not on services or salaries.
- Mr. Geller would like to give recognition to those individuals who contributed to these buildings.
