2018-19 was an active year for Margaret Manson Home and School Association.   of the pumpkin, Pick the Nose of Frankenstein and a Monster Raffle with prizes ranging from \$50 \$300
- \$2330 raised in total (\$1540 last year)
- limitations: location in gym too small (max accommodation is 225)

QSP and Mabels Labels - yearlong magazine and clothing label fundraisers launched

### Bake Sale - Parent Teacher Interviews - Term 1

baked goods and coffee offered for 2 days; generated \$570 in profits

### Recettes En Pot Fundraiser

- offered recipes in a jar for second year; sales provided jobs to local artisans operating in the social economy and school received one serving of soup with every sale - donated to On Rock
- 50% profit margins
- \$1439 total raised mainly through online ordering

 NOTES: simple fundraiser if run online; however, online site for ordering still problematic this year; similar profits noted to last year even though fundraiser was moved to run before the Holidays

- annual charitable campaign collected 27 boxes of food for On Rock, 100 toys and gifts for Children's Hospital and enough cash donations to purchase 30 turkeys

- hosted continental style holiday breakfast for entire school including staff...even Santa visited!
- provided candy canes for children for Comfy Cozy Reading

### Year End BBQ

- raffle for adults with prizes ranging from \$20-\$200
